

From Tragedy to Blessings Two Lay Apostles Spread the Messages

You may be wondering how in the world you can get others introduced to our apostolate. One way is to draw on the strength and organization of other groups which are already well established in your parish.

On Saturday, September 29th, a Day of Reflection on Divine Mercy was held at Our Lady of Fatima in Tucson, Arizona. The theme for this retreat was "Be Still and Know That I Am God." Lay Apostles Terri Gastellum and

Debbie Otero used this as an opportunity to help spread the messages of the apostolate. Here is Terri's inspiring account of how a personal tragedy has been turned into a blessing for many.

"My eighteen year old daughter Elisa lost her life in a car accident on February 24, 2006, and I struggled with her dying suddenly without Confession. After reading the books Climbing the Mountain and The Mist of Mercy, I received much healing and consolation. The merciful messages from Jesus and our Blessed Mother took away my fears about my daughter's salvation. I immediately wanted to share the books with everyone!

"I lent the books to my sister Debbie, who also lost her oldest son Jose in a car accident on September 30, 1996. He was also 18 years old. After reading the books, Debbie agreed that we should share these messages at our Day of Reflection.

"My sister Debbie and I gave our testimony on 'Trust.' We talked about our children, Elisa and Jose, who were both 18 when Our Lord called them home. They both died in car accidents, and they both had a love for God, family and friends. Being teenagers, they both struggled with temptation, but Elisa and Jose had a special devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Two weeks before Jose died he visited the Blessed Sacrament and sang 'Be Not Afraid' to the Lord. The day before Elisa died she went to the Blessed Sacrament and shared that Jesus had yelled at her! When asked why and where she replied, 'I went to the Blessed Sacrament yesterday and you know how nervous I've been to go to Mexico to learn Spanish.



Well, the Lord spoke to me so loudly that I felt it in my stomach. He said three times, 'Be Not Afraid, Be Not Afraid, Be Not Afraid!' The next evening Our Lord came for Elisa. Throughout the days of sorrow which followed our children's deaths, knowing that our children loved God gave us so much comfort.

"I then presented information about the Lay Apostles of Jesus Christ the Returning King. I explained who Anne is. I talked about private revelation and the permission Anne's bishop has given to spread the messages and the apostolate. I shared a little about the books and how these messages tie in with the Divine Mercy. I explained how these are exciting times and that Our Lord is asking us to become His Lay Apostles and be part of this 'Rescue Mission.'

"We asked a few of our helpers to go into the Adoration chapel with a microphone and we cued them when to read a message from the Heaven Speaks booklets. No one could see them, only hear their voices. For example, I would say, 'Our Lord has a message for those who have gone

> through a divorce,' and then someone would read the message. We shared messages for people with addictions, stress, young adults, depression and divorce.

> "I ended by encouraging them to order these books, Volumes, and booklets. We gave everyone 20 minutes to reflect on an area in their life that they were struggling with.

"We concluded with an hour of Adoration, reciting the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3:00, and then reciting the Rosary. There were two hours of Confessions heard that day. Praise the Lord!"

Although Terri and Debbie were very nervous, they prayed and fasted in preparation for this holy day. They reminded themselves that

they were just the vessels being obedient to the Lord, and He would take care of the rest. Terri believes that her daughter's real work began when she left this earth, and is now an intercessor in heaven on behalf of the Lay Apostles of Jesus Christ the Returning King. In God's perfect plan, tragedy has been turned to blessing.

Ur office often receives calls from lay apostles who are eager to find out when and where Anne will be speaking next about the rescue mission. We inform all callers that, in obedience to Jesus, Anne will not be traveling outside of Ireland in the immediate future. I believe this is God's way of requesting that we, His beloved lay apostles, step out in faith to bring the messages to our parishes and our communities.

Every time Anne gave a talk at a parish or a Eucharistic Day of Renewal during the last three years, there was a surge of interest in the messages. Many people who attended felt compelled to share

heaven's messages with their family members and their friends. As staff, we are privileged to hear stories of the conversions and healings that result from a soul's willingness to pick up and read the Volumes, the booklets, or the books. Jesus has promised that all lay apostles who welcome others to the rescue mission will be placed in His Sacred Heart, and they and their loved ones will be defended and protected. *"It is crucial that souls listen to Me. If you, My chosen souls, respond to Me in a halfhearted way, we will never save the souls who are being batted about the world like so many embers from a fire." (Jesus, July 7, 2003, Volume One).*

Delivering God's Good News

Anne, a lay apostle

A lovely apostle was talking to another woman. The woman's daughter was a recovering drug addict with two children and an absent father. She had recently returned to the Church.

The mother sighed heavily and said, "She's a bit of a disaster."

The apostle replied with loving indignation, "You are so wrong. Your daughter is a triumph for each one of us. The whole family of God is blessed because she has returned to us. We badly needed her back so we must do everything we can to help her in these early days of her return."

This filled the mother with joy and that, my friends, is the correct spirit.

It will be good if we can all be aware that each of those around us is somewhere in the process of perfection. We must be acutely aware of God's project in each soul, in each other, and respect that God is moving as quickly as He can. Also, we want to be certain that we contribute to God's process in each soul and not detract from God's effort.

Consider how an aid worker treats a person who is starving and in serious condition through being deprived of nourishment over time. The aid worker does not offer this person rich foods in great quantity. The starvation victim would be unable to tolerate rich foods in great quantity. The aid worker gently offers little bits of nourishment, often and regularly. In this way the starvation victim is not overwhelmed or shocked.

Consider the dreadful disease of anorexia nervosa. In this disease, a victim denies his or her body the nourishment it requires to function optimally. This disease can advance to a degree where the sufferer no longer feels hunger and indeed does not understand that he or she is starving to death.

It is the same way with prayer. To be spiri-

tually nourished, we must pray and participate in the sacraments. Through prayer and the sacraments, Jesus sends grace, which can be thought of as heavenly food for our souls.

Those who have not prayed or experienced sacramental graces in a long time are spiritually starving but, like the anorexia sufferer, do not even feel the pangs of spiritual hunger and starvation.

When we look to those around us who are

away from the Church, away from the sacraments and things that are heavenly, we must consider them the same way. To expect a starvation victim to either ingest a lot of food at

once or recover immediately after one meal would be unrealistic and to expect someone who has fallen away to be restored to spiritual wellness instantly is unrealistic.

Let us have an optimal expectation, of course, because we would never be wise to limit God's power and influence, but let us be acutely aware of the gradual nature of most conversions.

If someone has been away from God for some time, do not begin with "You are a sinner."

We are each sinners and we must all be assured that most souls away from God are aware of their condition. We are not called to be the sin police. We are called to be the deliverers of God's love.

Give heavenly sustenance in small doses wrapped in simple packages. "God loves you. God is with you. God will heal you. God will come for you one day. God will protect His interests in your soul if you allow Him to do so."

Also, it is a snare to place an expectation on the recipient of the love we bring. We think, I have brought you this nourishment. I know it to be good. Why don't you take it and walk like me or walk in the manner that I believe to be holy?

We can be tempted to get frustrated with the recipient because he does not advance fast enough or because he backslides at times. We are tempted to treat each person moving slowly as a personal failure.

How do we deliver God's Good News?

We must be very reverent, reverent. The Savior is at work. Tread lightly when you are allowed to impact the soul of another.

In which circumstances will My heart be so hardened that I will refuse to rush in with forgiveness and grace and an alternative plan for you? Such circumstances do not exist. My dearest little apostles, be assured of My willingness to work with you in each moment, regardless of your condition in that moment. In humanity, there are moments of such holiness that even heaven stops to marvel. In humanity, there are also moments of weakness and cruelty. Please believe that heaven takes the bad with the good and moves each willing soul toward greater and greater good. Heaven draws you away from temptation and away from the pain of sin. I am good, My friends, as My Father is good. You, My beloved apostles, are called to resemble Me and be good also. You strive for this, I know. Today I ask that each apostle consider that I treated others with kindness. I have instructed you about gentleness and today I instruct you about kindness. Little apostles, the hearts of others are easily wounded. Can you remember when someone treated you unkindly? Do you remember your pain? I was

treated unkindly at times and My heart felt this same pain. We do not want this for others. We want others to understand that God loves them and you, My friends, will do that when you treat them with the kindness of the Father. I will help you if you allow Me. I will teach you to remain silent in the presence of other's faults and I will teach you to speak openly about their strengths. Pause again and try to think of a kindness that was shown to you. Do you remember how you felt at that time? You felt grateful, did you not? You felt steadied. I want to flow through you to others. You will allow Me to do so if you work each day on being kind to each person you encounter. Their pain will lessen because of your kindness. The pain of the whole world will be reduced if each of My beloved apostles learns to be kind. Begin by being kind to yourself. I accept you, My friend. You must accept yourself. Be at peace in My love for you. I do not give you an instruction without also giving you the grace to carry it out so now I will teach you about kindness.

My beloved apostle, I understand your struggles. You are becoming holier and yet you do not think you are making progress. Dear one, can you accept that the holier you become, the more holiness you crave? Can you accept that the more you become aware of your own flaws, the more willing you are to accept flaws in others? I am at peace that you are coming to know Me better. Each day brings growth of some kind for you, even if that growth originates in mistakes acknowledged and corrected. I understand you, dear apostle. I know that on some days you are ready for the battle of holiness and that on some days you feel you are not strong enough for the battle. This is what I want to tell you. You rise each day and pledge your allegiance to the Father. This commitment of your day insures that your Father takes you each day in the condition He finds you. Each weakness is used to increase your humility and illuminate for you the path to transformation. Do not become discouraged by the need for improvement. Our greatest goal for you is holiness because only in holiness will you find peace and joy. Look around you. How many have committed themselves to holiness as you have committed yourself to holiness? And yet, every person, regardless of their condition, longs for the holiness you seek, even if their longing is denied and ignored. My heart is moved to such pity for those who do not seek Me. Let your heart also be moved to pity. Show constant compassion, never judgment, to those who do not understand what they lack. I am trying to show you, My beloved apostle, that you have begun a journey that must be taken by each person who will spend eternity in the family of God. If others delay the journey, that is their affair. My beloved apostles understand that this journey, the journey to holiness, is the most important journey they will ever take. This is your first priority, My friends. Continue to make your pledge and I will see to it that you become holier.

A Priest Talks About Holiness

For me, to be a holy person meant "saying" prayers, and to be holier meant saying more prayers. When I got over the enthusiasm of my early years I decided that I had to become a man of prayer, so I started to do something about it.

But when I began my prayers each day, and looked back over the previous day, it just hadn't happened. It wasn't of course that I was leading some kind of dissolute life, I hope, but I just did not see signs of what being a holy person meant. This is hard for me to explain, but for ten or twelve or more years, I each day decided I had to make a fresh start. Not just to do better the next day, but to make a totally new start again. And so it went on, day after day. In rural Ireland, and for the likes of me, spiritual direction was just not an option. Then one day it suddenly struck me - I couldn't make myself holy. Holiness didn't belong to me. Holiness belonged to God alone, and only He could make anyone holy. My reaction was: "Over to You, Lord!"

Of course there wasn't an overnight success, but, and again this is quite true as far as I can discern it, I never had to start from scratch again. I often had to decide that I had to try harder and so on and bit by bit I think that the good Lord was getting the better of me.

Some years later something happened at my prayer one day. There was nothing extraordinary, just that I knew that it was a good session. But after I finished my prayer I discovered that I was a different person. The difference was quite total and left me changed. Various blocks had disappeared. Decisions considered but not made were suddenly there without my making a conscious act of will. A persistent, troublesome and nightly temptation disappeared completely and so on and so on. All my life I woke up a few times during the night and now as soon as I woke, my first thought suddenly became that I was in the presence of God-a total change from what had been for years an insidious pull. It was more than just a change.

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It was more like a complete metamorphosis. All I can still do is remember it in awe. Strangely, I don't recall being in any way excited, taking it in my stride almost, just accepting that it was the kind of thing the Lord did, not only because He is mighty but because He is mighty good, and picks on the most unlikely people, certainly not the most deserving. It was quite clear that the Holy Spirit had quietly done something quite out of the ordinary. into our lives, but a week, a month later they have faded away and seem to be completely forgotten. But I am talking about a few ideas, events and happenings that years later are as fresh and clear in my mind as the time they occurred and are still as effective as they were at first. In some of them it is quite clear from their very nature that the Lord has a hand in them. With others, it seems that the fact that they are still so fresh in my mind and operative in my



Two things happened that I think I should mention at this stage, one immediately.

From that day to this, there have been very few days that I didn't spend two hours before the Blessed Sacrament. Lately that has begun to increase. There is no great effort on my part. I take no credit for it. My day just wouldn't be normal without it. I think that from the point of view of my spirituality it is normally a very pedestrian event, and I sometimes question whether I am living up to my understanding of my spirituality, whether I'm giving the Lord space to get at me.

The other thing is this. At irregular intervals something happens that seems to give a fillip to my life. Retreats, spiritual reading, an inspiring sermon, I suppose all these things feed spiritual life makes me sure that they have come from the Lord too. Each time it seems to lift me up a little, to a slightly higher plateau, and now most of the time I am not very far from the presence of God, and the Jesus prayer keeps cropping up.

And in spite of all this, I'm afraid that I'm very far down on the ladder. Sometimes in my prayers, when they are going well you would think I am a veritable saint. And then I can go out and waste time, dally over the TV, gossip about my fellow priests and tell stories where I come out in a good light, and so on! I suppose that's me! You can't make a silk purse out of a sow's ear!

I think people, including priests, are afraid to get into prayer. If only they would give it a try and a chance.

Do you allow Him into your pain? Do not keep this pain from Him because if you do, you make it worse. Constantly give Him your pain. There are few souls on earth who use heaven as completely as heaven would like to be used. Trust heaven for everything. You worry that you are not pleasing to heaven because of your sadness and heavy heart. I assure you, heaven is pleased right now that you are taking the time to read these words and work with us. You are not a burden to heaven. You are heaven's joy and you are a gift to the world in which you live. You may feel you are not treated like a gift in the world. That may be very true. But most of heaven's greatest gifts to the world are treated badly so do not let this worry you. Look what they did to our Jesus. The world does not always recognize heaven's little treasures. But you are different because you are going to trade earthly eyes for heavenly eyes. Look with the eyes of heaven now and view your suffering as temporary and valuable. Soft little hearts are wounded easily but that does not mean you should desire to have a hard heart. I shudder at the thought. Be happy with the heart that Jesus has given you. Seek understanding from the angels and saints and you will find it. Be patient with those around you because perhaps they are in their own pain and it makes them unable to minister to you. This is the state in much of the world, my dear friend. That is why there is so much

sadness. But we will deal with your sadness first, and then you will help others to find heaven's joy.

St. Dymphna

Do not be afraid. There is nothing that should make you be afraid. Jesus will care for your needs and you will care for His. Fear is paralyzing many on earth at this time. This brings us back to the need for the heavenly eyes. If you look at your situation and view it as heaven views it, you will understand that there is nothing on the earth that should make you fearful. You will serve for a time and then you will die in your body. This is the way it has always been. This is heaven's plan. This is not a bad thing but a good thing. Imagine living on earth indefinitely. That would make you sad because it would take away your hope that your time of service will end and your time in heaven will begin. If souls on earth do not think well of you and they ridicule you, well, my friend, that puts you in the greatest company you could find. They did not think well of Jesus. They ridiculed Jesus. That you cannot get through a day? He will get you through that day and preserve each moment for eternity by using each moment for the salvation of others, who may be suffering even more than you. This is the truth. This is where you are needed at this moment perhaps. Will you make the most use of it?

You feel the great graces that flow from these words and from this mission. Ask for these graces and continue asking for each soul you meet because Jesus is not limiting the amount of love and healing He is sending during this time. Do you hear

me? Jesus is not limiting graces. We should celebrate. You are thinking that perhaps St. Paul has gotten the wrong topic. How can I talk about joy when you feel so sad? Well, it is exactly then that I need to talk about joy and all of the saints will agree with me. You see, we had joy in hope but we did not always have *joyful experiences on the earth. The very thought* would make us shake our heads. We marvel sometimes at the depth of suffering that is possible while you are in exile, away from heaven. Now, my friends, please understand that great sadness is not always a tragedy. If you never felt sad you would have difficulty in comforting others who feel sad. This would be the real tragedy, would it not? To see another soul in pain and not be able to offer consolation? It is better to receive consolation from a soul who has experience with the trial you are enduring. You understand this, I know. So do not begrudge Jesus this time of sadness in your life. Through it He will bring the greatest benefit to your soul. I know that you might not agree with me but that is because you do not see what I see. I am in heaven and I see far more than you are capable of understanding. So perhaps you will trust me, and respect that I have the greater vision. If you walk through your dark period with Jesus, He will sow seeds of the greatest holiness in your soul. He will nourish your soul and tend to it lovingly. At the end of the trial, you will be a different person in that you will have a far greater capacity to house heaven in your soul and allow heaven to flow

through you. You will benefit from this trial. This is Truth. You will benefit. Will you benefit from an earthly perspective? No, my friend, not unless it is a Christian earthly perspective and then the benefits will be recognized. But generally, your world sees suffering as bad and to be avoided. My dearest little child, you need not be so sad. I am with you and I will take care of you. When you do not feel heaven's presence, it is only because you have turned away. It does not mean we are not there with you, interceding for you, watching you closely, and protecting you as you suffer. I love you most tenderly and I see that your heart is heavy and burdened. I do not like to see anyone suffering, ever, but I understand that it can be heaven's will. I watched my poor little Son suffer terribly, and while I objected through my entire soul, I understood that heaven's plan was more important and more productive than a mother's plan. God's plans must always come first, of course, if we are followers of God. And there is no other way to happiness. Please, dear child of heaven, trust me that I will remain with you through your cross and that I will obtain all that you need to persevere through this trial. I will help you in many quiet ways that you cannot see. I will always be there with you. Seek out my assistance. I will go to the Throne of God and bring you with me. 
